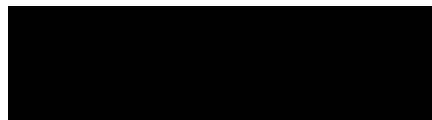


Dear Justin,

What is the difference between Cornell Law's Reserve list process and what is traditionally known as a 'waitlist'?

A 'waitlist' typically implies that there are no available spots to offer, and an offer may be made if a spot opens (typically after deposit deadlines). Unlike a traditional 'waitlist', we continually review our reserve list group throughout the admissions cycle. Occasionally, we may offer admission to applicants on the reserve list before deposit deadlines in the spring. After our deposit deadlines in the spring, our Reserve list operates like a traditional 'waitlist.'
